Tapestry is our chosen online learning tool- where you can send in vidoes of your child to your child's teacher. This is a lovely way to stay in touch and I believe Ruth Cotterill even sent you all a video story last week! I just need to persuade some more staff to take the plunge and have a go!

I will continue to follow all DfE and Government guidelines to manage the safety of the school, staff and children attending York Road and will update you of any new procedures. Please do keep an eye on the guidelines and advice yourselves- but do not overload - it can become quite stressful if you watch too much on TV or on social media and we all need to maintain a healthy mind.

I am just coming out of self-isolation as one of my own children and myself have been unwell with this virus. It's not been fun and we can all keep each other safe by staying at home. My father lives near the beach and he sadly reported to me that he has seen so many people breaking the rules and being close together on the seafront.
