We are trying to improve the children's ability to compare, sort, use new words to describe the spoons and much more. Please write your

child's name on your spoons so they can be matched back up at the end of the day.



Our MyHappyMind book this term is 'Arabella and her friends at the seaside'. The story talks about Arabella being pleased her friends came to play and saying, 'Thank you' to her parents.

We will be talking to the children about kind actions and showing appreciations to others. You can support your child by talking to them daily about the good things that have happened and who you have said 'Thank you' to and why. It does not have to be huge things—it can be simple as - 'seeing the birds', 'sleeping well' and saying thank you for a 'smile' someone gave you.

Sharing 'grateful' is a positive activity for families to do. If you write your 'gratefults' down and save in a box, they will always be there for you to read and share if you have difficult days.
