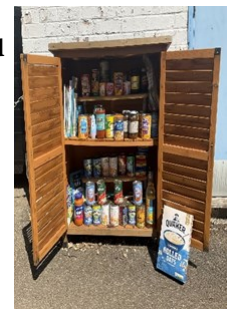
SAVE THE DATE: 28th June from 4.00 - 5.30 is going to be our 2nd World Celebration Evening for the whole family to attend.
